**Reversal of female sterilisation
and reversal of male sterilisation (vasectomy)**

Thames Valley Priorities Committee has reviewed the provision of reversal of female sterilisation and reversal of male sterilisation procedures across Thames Valley CCGs.

Sterilisation aims to permanently remove fertility by means of vasectomy (male sterilisation) or tubal occlusion (female sterilisation), therefore the providers of this service must adhere to the national recommendations in their provision of pre-sterilisation assessment, counselling and obtaining a valid consent.

Reversal of female sterilisation and reversal of male sterilisation is **not normally funded**.

NOTES:

- Potentially exceptional circumstances may be considered by a patient's CCG where there is evidence of significant health status impairment (e.g. inability to perform activities of daily living) and there is evidence that the intervention sought would improve the individual's health status.
- This policy will be reviewed in the light of new evidence or new national guidance, e.g., from NICE.
